About the Band

The Ophir Prison Marching Kazoo Band & Temperance Society, Lmtd. has been delighting audiences and packing concert venues for over 35 years.

They are a 25- to 50-piece ensemble with pep band-type instrumentation—woodwinds, brass, and percussion—and the music they play encompasses a wide variety of genres. Members' ages range from early 20's to late 70's.

Outfitted in highly personalized "prison blues" and with tongues firmly in cheek, band members will tell you they're from Ophir Prison, an historic minimum-security facility tucked away in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada. Whatever their true origins, though, they share a love of music, fun, and showing audiences a great time.

And *that* is something at which the Ophir Prison Band truly excels.

Just a few recent examples:

- The band filled nearly
 10,000 seats over the
 course of seven performances at the 2009 Sacramento Jazz Jubilee, bringing overflow crowds
 into the festival's largest venues nightly. This marked the band's 14th consecutive year as a
 Jubilee favorite.
- Following in the footsteps of Johnny Cash, B.B. King, and other musical heavyweights, the band entertained *real* inmates at San Quentin State Prison in 2008.
- Radio station 93.7 Jack-FM hired the band to warm up the crowd before a rock concert featuring ZZ Top, the Pretenders, and the Stray Cats at Sacramento's ARCO Arena in 2007. (The band prefers to think of it as, "We opened for ZZ Top, the Pretenders, and the Stray Cats.")
- The band was repeatedly featured on KMAX Channel 31's Good Day Sacramento morning television show in 2004 and 2005.

About the Band (continued)

Since 1973, the Ophir Prison Band has logged more than 400 performances throughout California and Nevada. In addition to the highlights listed earlier, the band's legacy includes the following:

- The band has performed at professional sporting events such as San Francisco Giants baseball games and Golden State Warriors and Sacramento Kings NBA games, as well as at several other professional and amateur sporting events.
- In 2007, the HBO television series *The Sopranos* used the Ophir Prison Band's recording of *Livin' La Vida Loca* in the Season 6 episode "Chasing It."
- The band has entertained guests at Six Flags Magic Mountain theme park, the Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk, the California State Fair, and numerous county fairs.
- Images of the band have appeared on the front page of newspapers both big and small, from USA TODAY to the Sacramento Bee to Woodland's Daily Democrat.
- Since the band's inception, it has appeared in more than 50 parades celebrating Independence Day, often doing multiple parades over holiday weekends.

The Show

An Ophir Prison Band performance is a unique, high-energy blend of music, humor, and antics.

The band's musical repertoire includes something for almost everybody—big band, jazz, jump swing, rock, "novelty" numbers, patriotic marches, traditional band music, and odes to beer, the band's favorite libation.

(Note: While beer does figure prominently in the band's act, you don't have to be "of legal age" to enjoy the band's performance; the show can be tailored to meet an event's needs.)

One can understand how audience members might initially wonder what they've gotten themselves into when this band of "prisoners" raucously marches into view. But the Ophir Prison Band's solid musicianship and contagious joy quickly wins them over. Observe a "live" performance and it becomes obvious that both the band and the audience are having fun.

The band's playlist of more than 70 songs (available at http://www.ophirprison.com/extra/music.pdf and subject to change) gives one an idea of what to expect at a show.

Or does it?

Here are just a few things one might experience at an Ophir performance:

- During Rubber Duckie/Put Down the Duckie, rubber ducks take flight and a rubber chicken improvises on saxophone. Don't be caught looking the wrong way.
- Do-Re-Mi, a song about the seven-note major scale, is turned into a song about something with which the band is more familiar: beer.
- The way the Ophir Prison Band performs
 Take Me Out to the Ball Game, audiences
 are unable to sing along with a second
 chorus, even though the second chorus has
 the same words as the first.

- Basin Street Blues is anything but blue, racing at breakneck speed until the band kicks those blues permanently... chorus line style!
- Kazoos buzz through *The Stars and* Stripes Forever while the famously difficult piccolo solo is tackled by a much more unwieldy instrument: a sousaphone.
- Frankly, there's just something inherently funny about 30 grown men singing the theme to The Mickey Mouse Club television show.
- And, speaking of Frank... Frank is the band's rubber chicken, capable of belief-defying tricks in addition to his aforementioned musical prowess.
- Meanwhile, trumpets dance, saxes wander into the audience. trombones rock, sousaphones bounce, drums roll—it's a dynamic show, with lots of spontaneity.



Keeping the whole lot under control (barely) is the band's Dum Major, Capt. Rufus T. Whizbang. Resplendent in multicolored coattails and a pith helmet topped by a wind-up key, Capt. Whizbang keeps the show rolling, directing the band using a plunger as his baton and cracking jokes at will (or at anyone *else* within earshot).






Behind Bars Everywhere

This 2010 release features a quasi-variety show of live concert favorites mixed in with TV spoofs, as well as video evidence of the band's 2008 performance at San Quentin State Prison and decades-old footage of treasured band shtick and antics. As with the previously released "Ophir: EXPOSED!," the disc is generously sprinkled with gags in unexpected places, including the credits, faux commercials, deleted scenes, and much more. A romping complement to the band's first DVD, and sure to be a unique and fun addition to anyone's collection.



Ophir: EXPOSED!

The wacky visual aspects of the band finally made it to the Digital Age with this DVD's 2006 release. The first half of the disc purports to document efforts to locate historic Ophir Prison and to trace the band's history back longer than any sensible person has a right to expect... or believe. Plenty of energetic live performance footage fills the rest of the time. Lots of funny surprises, even in such mundane DVD features as "Language Selection" and "Director's Commentary." The disc is part send-up, part concert video, and all fun.



Back in the Slammer

For this 2003 release, the band recorded in a studio environment. The improved production values allow the content—which includes several crowd favorites, improvisational solos, and comical bits—to shine. A few live performance gags also made their way onto the disc.



Jailbreak!

The band's inaugural CD, released in 2001, contains recordings of live performances at the Sacramento Jazz Jubilee, the Nevada County Fairgrounds, and elsewhere. Many favorites of long-time Ophir fans are included.
